Holy Days of Obligation Why we need to go to Mass other than on Sunday

We know that we must attend Mass on Sundays, as the Third Commandment calls us to Keep Holy the Sabbath (Lord's Day). But the Church in its great Wisdom has other days within each year that we are to participate in the Mass. These days are called Holy Days of Obligation. This means that we are obligated to do this as part of our Catholic Faith.

The Precepts of the Church, which are laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in the love of God and neighbor (CCC 2041). The first Precept of the five is "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor".

As the Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice, we are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on Sundays and holy days of obligation unless excused for a serious reason. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin (CCC 2181).

The Catechism also tells us that Sunday celebration of the Mass is the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church. The other holy days of obligation within the United States are:

Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God – January 1st.

Easter – always on Sunday

The Ascension (traditionally on a Thursday 40 days after Easter, but moved to Sunday in the U.S)

The Assumption of the Blessed Mother (August 15th)

All Saints Day (November 1st)

The Feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception (December 8th)

Christmas – the Nativity of our Lord Jesus (December 25th)

Epiphany – is now always celebrated the first Sunday after Christmas

With the holy days of obligation, it is good to remember this provides us the opportunity to spend time with Christ in the Liturgy of the Word and in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. We should want to participate in the Mass as many times as we can - not only on these required days, but the daily Mass as well. Participation and reception of the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist provides the graces needed for us to continue to grow in our faith and love of Christ and each other.



During this time fraternal benefit societies and anti-Catholic prejudice took men away from their Catholic faith. Dangerous factory working conditions left many families fatherless.

Father McGivney proposed establishing a lay organization to prevent Catholic men from entering secret societies opposed to Church teaching thus uniting Catholic men and helping families of deceased members. The founding members took Christopher Columbus, recognized as a Catholic and celebrated as the discoverer of America as their patron. In addition to the Orders financial products that help protect their families, Catholic men are drawn to the Knights because of its emphasis on serving one's Church, Community and Family with virtue. Today the Knights of Columbus has close to two million members in various countries throughout the world.

The Holy Father's Intentions for the Month of January 2022



The Great Adventure Bible Timeline, is a ground-breaking approach to understanding salvation history developed by renowned Catholic Bible teacher Jeff Cavins.

The Great Adventure Bible Timeline Philosophy:

- Identifies the 14 narrative books that tell the story of Scripture from beginning to end. The remaining “supplemental books” of the Bible are then contextualized within the storyline of the 14 narrative books.
- Divides the Bible into 12 time periods, identified by different colors, which serve as “chapters” in Salvation History.

How to Use the Reading Plan:

This reading plan covers the entire Catholic Bible in 365 days. Readings in bold refer to the 14 narrative books of the Bible.

The Psalms and Proverbs are spread out throughout the year to provide additional opportunity for prayer, reflection, and practical wisdom. The Psalms in italics have a particular connection to that day’s other readings.


